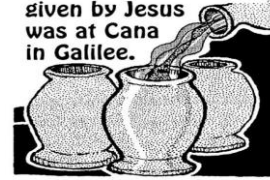

Congress is preparing to debate health care reform legislation on the House and Senate floors. The U.S. bishops' conference has concluded that all committee approved bills are seriously deficient on the issues of abortion and conscience, and do not provide adequate access to health care for immigrants and the poor.
